The March program will feature noted forensic pathologist, **Dr. Jamie Downs**. He will speak on the Forensic Pathology Study of the Final *Hunley* Crew. Dr. Downs was a member of the forensic efforts to identify the final *Hunley* crew.

Dr. Downs is coastal Georgia's first Regional Medical Examiner. He has been continuously employed as a Medical Examiner since 1989 and was Alabama's State Forensics Director and Chief Medical Examiner from 1998 to 2002. He has lectured extensively in the field of forensic pathology and has presented at numerous national and international meetings in the fields of anatomic and forensic pathology. He is a consultant to the FBI Behavioral Science Unit in Quantico, Virginia. He has authored several book chapters in the field of forensic pathology. He lectures regularly at the National Forensic Academy and at the FBI's National Academy. Professional activities have included service on numerous professional boards and committees. He was graduated from the University of Georgia in 1983, magna cum laude and Phi Beta Kappa. He received his doctor of medicine degree and his residency training in anatomic and clinical pathology, and his fellowship in forensic pathology from the Medical University of South Carolina (Charleston).
